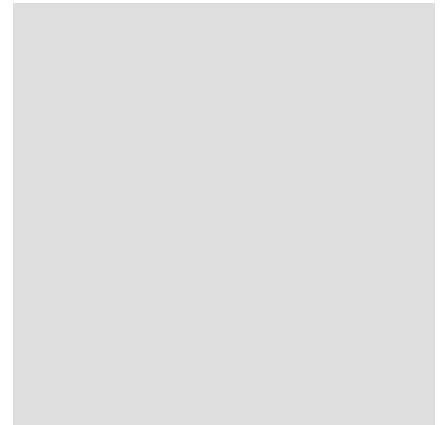




Student behaviour

By defining the roles, responsibilities and expectations of teachers, students and parents, we are able to create a safe, happy and productive learning environment.

Values

Values underpin learning at our school and are taught in every area of school life.

Children are encouraged to understand the importance of respect, responsibility, integrity, excellence, open-mindedness, cooperation, participation, care, fairness and democracy.

Our expectations of students

All students and teachers have the right to feel safe and happy at school and to be treated fairly and with respect. We expect certain behaviour of your child in the classroom, in the school playground and travelling to and from school.

Students are expected to:

- attend school every day – unless legally excused
- come to class ready to learn
- treat others with respect
- cooperate with staff, follow class rules, speak courteously and cooperate with instructions and learning activities
- wear school uniform and keep a neat appearance
- behave safely and responsibly at all times, including travel to and from school, on excursions and attending sporting events
- care for school property, their own property and the property of others.

Encouraging positive behaviour

We have a range of strategies and programs in place to encourage positive behaviour at school including social skills programs, peer support, anti-bullying plans, student counselling, parental involvement and disciplinary action.

School discipline policy

We have a school discipline policy that has been developed collaboratively with students, staff and parents. These strategies include developing student responsibilities, encouraging respect and creating positive conditions for effective teaching and learning.
