

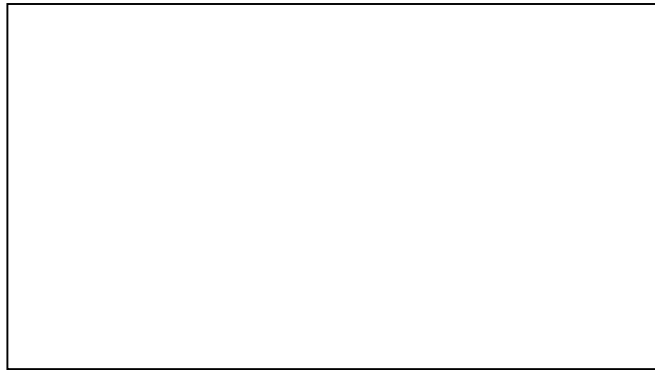
The Bunyip
